

# Important information about uniform

positive behaviour and discipline and encourage identity with and support for the academy ethos. A key reason for the academy uniform is to ensure students of all races and social and economic backgrounds feel welcome and protect students from social pressures to dress in a particular way. Students at the academy are expected to wear correct uniform at all times.

Acceptable attire includes:

- Blue jumper and cardigan
- Blue gingham dress
- A school pinafore in black or grey with a white shirt and tie underneath (this can be a plain white polo without a tie in EYFS and KS1).
- Black or grey trousers
- Black or grey shorts
- Black or grey knee-length skirts
- White polo shirt (EYFS & KS1)
- Whitehill shirt and tie (KS2)
- Plain black school shoes suitable for activities such as the daily mile.
- A coat suitable for playing outside in adverse weather.

### P.E. Kit and Other Items

Acceptable P.E. attire includes:

- Plain white t-shirt or polo top
- Black knee length shorts
- Trainers, suitable for both indoor and outdoor
- Grey hoodie
- Black, navy or grey jogging bottoms or leggings
- A plain blue or black hoodie or sweatshirt. This can include the school hoodie or the standard school sweatshirt.

Please ensure that all items have your child's name written clearly in them and that you check this regularly, as it often washes off after a while!

We now have a stock of spare pumps, ties, jumpers and other uniform items. If your child comes into school in the incorrect uniform or with items missing, they will be provided with a spare for the day and you will be contacted.

We understand that most uniform issues are out of the child's control and that some families may need support to provide the correct clothing for school. If you have any concerns regarding your child's school uniform, please contact class teachers in the first instance. We will be able to direct you to appropriate support and, in some cases, can provide missing items.

#### Make the right footwear choices...

Parents should be aware that only plain black shoes are permitted in the academy - there must be no white/coloured labels, logos, markings, buckles or studs. Shoes must be leather or leather look.

Footwear must be sensible. Pumps, high heels, or boots of any kind are not allowed. The images below provide some examples. If you are unsure, please contact the academy to clarify before making a purchase. This is not an exhaustive list and is designed to provide a guide.



## Make-up, cosmetics & Jewellery:

- Please avoid new piercings during term time as this can impact on PE. Small stud earrings may be worn, but will have to be removed by the child for PE.
- On health and safety grounds, we do not permit the wearing of jewellery by pupils. The only exception to this is pupils may wear one small plain stud in each ear as above.
- 2 A wrist watch may be worn (smart watches should not be worn).
  - Make-up, false and painted nails or unnatural hair colours are not permitted. Neither are any other piercings (e.g. nose). All these items will have to be removed by the child or parent.
  - The Academy does not permit the wearing of make-up and cosmetics unless there is a specific event the Head Teacher has given prior permission for.
